Accessibility and Usability Presenter: Mr. Michael Doñes

In this workshop, faculty will understand the legal obligation associated with creating a campus that is technologically accessible to students with disabilities. Faculty will learn how to incorporate best practices when creating and modifying materials using Microsoft PowerPoint and the Canvas Rich Content Editor. The accessibility checker in these programs will help faculty accommodate diverse learners.

Canvas Interface, Assignments and Quizzes

Grading in Canvas/Grade Passback
